HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct it to be notified, for general information, that the following Act will, on Tuesday the 10th of January next, be submitted to the consideration of the Legislative Council:—

An Act to adopt an Act of the 11th Geo. 4, and 1st Wm. 4, c. 73, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of an Act of the sixteenth year of His late Majesty King George the Third for the more effectual Prevention and Punishment of Blasphemous and seditious Libels, as relates to the Sentence of Banishment for the second Offence, and to provide some further Remedy against the abuse of publishing Libels;" and to nominate certain Officers and other Persons in this Colony, in order to render operative such of the Provisions of the following Acts as are applicable to the Circumstances of the Colony,—viz., the Act 38th Geo. 3, c. 78, intituled "An Act for preventing the Mischiefs arising from the Printing and Publishing Newspapers, and Papers of a like nature, by Persons not known, and for regulating the Printing and Publication of such Papers in other respects;"—and also the Act of 60th Geo. 3, and 1st Geo. 4, c. 8, intituled "An Act for the more effectual Prevention and Punishment of Blasphemous and seditious Libels;"—and also of the Act of 60th Geo. 3, and 1st Geo. 4, c. 9, intituled "An Act to subject certain Publications to the Duties of Stamp upon Newspapers, and to make other Regulations for restraining the abuses arising from the Publication of Blasphemous and seditious Libels."
