PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir James Stirling, Knt., Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS, by the third section of the Act of Council, passed in the second year of His present Majesty King William the Fourth, No 4, intituled "An Act to extend the Jurisdiction and regulate the Proceedings of the Court of Quarter Sessions," it is enacted, "that the Sessions of the said Court shall be held at such times and places as the Governor shall from time to time appoint by Proclamation;" and whereas it is expedient that a Session of the said Court shall be holden on Tuesday next, the 18th of July instant, at the Court-House, Perth:—Now, THEREFORE, I, the Go-VERNOR, do hereby, by this my Proclamation, pursuant to the provisions of the said Enactment, direct and appoint that a Session of the said Court shall be held at Perth on the aforesaid day.
