SOME misapprehension appearing to exist with respect to the nature of the intimation required from Persons who may have become Sureties for Printers and Publishers of Newspapers, and who may be desirous of withdrawing from such responsibility; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, for the information of all Parties concerned, that by the Act for regulating such Publications it is enacted, "that if any Surety or Sureties shall be desirous of withdrawing from such Recognizance or Bond, it shall or may be lawful for him or them so to do, upon giving 20 days' previous Notice in writing to the Colonial Secretary, and also to such Printer or Publisher; and that, in any such case, every such Surety or Sureties, from and after the expiration of such Notice, shall not be liable upon the said Bond or Recognizance, other than and except from any Penalty or Penalties before that time imposed or incurred."
