HIS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified for general information, that the undermentioned Acts have passed the Legislative Council, viz. :—

An Act for adopting and applying certain Acts of the Parliament of the United Kingdom, passed in the first year of Her present Majesty, in the Colony of Western Australia in like manner as other Laws of England are applied therein.

An Act to amend an Act intitled " *An Act to impose certain Duties on Imported Spirituous Liquors.*" and to extend the same, by imposing Duties on other enumerated Articles.

An Act for the Regulation of the Customs of Western Australia.

An Act to enable the Inhabitants of any Township to assess themselves for the Improvement of the Town.

An Act for appointing and authorising certain Persons to be Commissioners and to act as Guardians to Emigrants, being minors, sent to this Colony from the United Kingdom by a Society known by the style of "The Children's Friend Society."

IT being of very great importance to ascertain the existence of Coal in this Colony, His Excellency the Governor proposes to offer a grant of land of 2,560 acres as an inducement to persons who may be disposed to search for this valuable mineral.

Territory south of the parallel of the most northern part of Shark's Bay and west of the meridian of East Mount Barren.
