#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency John Hurr. Esquire, Governor and Commander in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies.

HEREAS by the sixth section of an Act of the Governor, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the second year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend an Act for the Regu lation of Pilotage and Shipping in the Harbours of Western Australia, it is, among other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, or Officer administering the Government of this Colony, by any Proclamation under his hand and seal, to fix and establish from time to time the Rates of Pilotage to be paid by all Ships or Vessels arriving at, or departing from, any of the Ports, Harbours, or Anchorages of the Colony:—Now know ye, therefore, that I, the Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the authority conferred upon me by the said recited Act, do hereby fix and establish the following scale of Rates to be henceforward paid by all Ships or Vessels arriving in or departing from any of the aforesaid Ports or Harbours or Anchorages respectively:-

RATES OF PILOTAGE, AND HARBOUR MASTERS' FEES FOR SHIPPING IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Into Cockburn Sound, Princess Royal Harbour, or Oyster Harbour, direct from Sea.

IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication of the general objects of the following Bill, about to be brought under the consideration of the Legislative Council.

A Bill to provide more suitable and summary remedies for the redress of complaints made by or against Seamen or others in the Merchant service in this Colony

Whereas much inconvenience has been felt for want of power to put seamen on board their ship, who have deserted therefrom, whereby many such persons have been left behind, to the injury of the Master of such ship, as well as to the detriment of the Colony;—It is proposed to make provision,

1st. That seamen deserting from any ship may be imprisoned till the ship is ready to proceed to sea, when they may be conveyed on board.

2d. Proviso, That the Master shall pay for the maintenance of such seaman, and all other reasonable expenses.

3. In order to provide a cheap and summary remedy for the redress of complaints against Masters of ships, that any complaint on the part of Mariner or Passenger for wages, or fer breach of contract, or for assault, where the cause of action or the amount of damages sought shall not exceed Ten Pounds, may be determined by two Justices. That Masters not attending when summoned may be proceeded against as, if present. That if party proceed in any superior Court for any such cause as aforesaid, he shall not recover more costs than One Pound.

4th. Proceedings not to be quashed for informality, nor removed by certiorari.

5th. Mode of recovery and appropriation of penalties.

6th. Duration of the Act.
