IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the Heads of the following Bill he is about to submit to the consideration of the Legislative Council, to be published for general information.

By His Excellency's command,

PETER BROWN.

A Bill to promote the Building of Churches and Chapels, and to contribute towards the maintenance of Ministers of Religion, in Western Australia.

It is proposed, 1st,—To make issues of public money in aid of the erection of Churches and Chapels in a certain proportion to the funds raised by private contribution for that purpose, up to a certain limit:

2.—To contribute towards maintenance of Ministers for such Churches or Chapels in proportion to the numbers desirous of attending such churches or

3.—That it shall be lawful to contribute certain sums also where the numbers are less than first mentioned in the foregoing section under special circumstances.

4.—That where numbers increase, the amount of stipend may be increased

5.—That where there is no church or chapel, sums may be issued towards the maintenance of the Minister in a certain proportion to the amount raised by private contribution.

6.—That proof shall be added.

6.—That proof shall be adduced of the due performance of the duties; and if such (duties be culpably neglected, the amount contributed towards the stipend may be withdrawn.

7.— That Trustees shall be appointed. 8.—That the Trustees may accept land,
