FERRY BETWEEN PERTH AND THE OPPOSITE SIDE OF THE SWAN.

THE arrangement between Joseph Ellis and the Government, for attending the Ferry between the Town of Perth and the opposite shore, having been discontinued, Notice is hereby given that a similar arrangement has been entered into with William Hyde, who will demand the following tolls, being in accordance with the proclamation establishing the said Ferry, published in the Government Gazette on the 23d March, 1839, No. 143,—

For each person, from sunrise to sundown, one shilling.

Ditto, from sundown to sunrise, two shillings.

If the boat be detained on the Perth side beyond half an hour, one shilling in addition; and for every hour, one shilling.

For every bag of flour, one shilling.

For every cask of two cwt., one shilling and six pence.

For larger casks, two shillings.

Small hand packages not chargeable; but larger ones six pence each.

For swimming horses across, two shillings each, before sundown; after which, until sunrise, four shillings each.

For soldiers, six pence each, when on duty; at other times one shilling each.
