SIR,-With reference to former correspendence on the subject of the increase of the minimum upset price of Land in Western Australia, and particularly to my Des-patch No. 10 of the 13th of March last in which you were instructed to raise the price to not less than 12s. an acre, I have to desire that, on the receipt of this Despatch, you will issue the necessary directions for the Sale of all Public Lands in the Colony at a fixed price of one pound per acre.
