**SIXTH QUARTERLY REPORT  
OF THE PROTECTOR OF ABORIGINES  
OVER THE HILLY COUNTRY.**

The natives around the District allotted to me, have not been so peaceable this Quarter as they generally have been since my residence among them.

Sundry instances of sheep stealing, and other offences, have occurred, owing, probably, to the unusual severity of the winter and the consequent scarcity of food. The attempts made by them at Toodyay to take the life of a settler, and the arrangement made for a similar attempt at Beverley, confirm me in the opinion that, for some cause, at present unknown, the Aboriginal tribe at the northern and Southern extremes of the settled parts of this Territory are not so peaceably disposed as those who are more directly in the heart of the settlement.

One case has occurred during this Quarter which has afforded me a good opportunity of shewing them that I am interested in themselves, as a body, and I feel satisfied that they are well aware that they may obtain redress from me where they are injured by their fellow creatures.

Two natives came before me and complained that another native had fired at them with a gun. I accordingly sent out

my two native constables, under the superintendence of the European constable who is attached to my department, to bring in the offender which they did at sunset. I tried the case; and finding that the prisoner pleaded "guilty," I sentenced him to four days and four nights solitary confinement, with a threat of sending him to Rottnest if ever he repeated the offence. The natives who accompanied the prisoner in great numbers, showing much interest on the occasion, went away expressing themselves perfectly satisfied.
