HIS Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct the publication of the following extract of a letter which has been received from Charles Symmons, Esquire, respecting the capture of the native "Men-dik," alias "Nic-cola," accused of the murder of a white boy on the Canning in July, 1839—

"With reference to a government notice dated March 18th, 1840, offering a reward of five pounds for the apprehension of a native named "Men-dik," alias "Nic-cola," accused of the murder of a white boy in the employ of John Randall Phillips, Esquire, of the Canning, in the month of July, 1839, I have the honor to communicate for the information of His Excellency the Governor, that, on Sunday evening last, the said "Men-dik" was brought into Perth and lodged in gaol. His capture was effected by a body of native constables sent out by me for that purpose, but who were most effectually aided by Mr. Edward Hester, of the Canning, to whose exertions and watchful precautions subsequent to his capture, the prisoner's safe arrival in Perth must be mainly attributable.
