BOUNDARIES OF LAND.

N Act to provide for the more effectual and accurate establishment of the Boundaries to Lands in this Colony, having been recently passed by the Legislative Council, the Governor deems it advisable to notify to the public that the general objects of the measure are to secure to the occupants of land the correct and undisputed possession of their grants by boundary marks actually established on the ground, which it is intended shall supersede all former descriptions in title deeds or assignments from the Government, depending upon lines to be measured or to be run in any direction by the compass.

In fixing the positions of these new boundary marks, the greatest care will be taken to adhere as closely as possible to the de-scriptions which have hitherto been given of lands, either in Deeds of Grant or in Letters of Assignment, in order that the same may be fully and effectually carried out on the ground according to original intention.

By a strict and impartial adherence to this principle in all possible cases, and the adoption of no new boundary marks on the ground until the surveys by which the same were fixed shall have been approved by the Governor in Council, and such approval published in the Government Gazette of

eorge Lazenby-making desks for native | the Coiony, certainty and security will be ensured to each holder or occupant of land, as well as to all persons having claims on the same.

The great importance of this measure to the Colonists generally, and an earnest desire on the part of the Government that this adoption of landmarks shall be satisfactorily completed, induce His Excellency to hope that every facility will be afforded to the District Surveyors in ascertaining the positions of any existing boundary marks or lines, or of such as may from accident or otherwise have been destroyed. With this view, and to enable land-owners and others to erect more permanent and durable landmarks at the corners of their grants than would probably be fixed by the Surveyors, the latter will be ready to meet their wishes on the ground by superintending the erection of such land-marks, while the boundaries may be in progress of survey, but not afterwards,----no new land-mark being admissible into the legal description of a grant from the Crown after such description shall have been notified in the Government Gazette as having been approved by the Governor in Council, and recorded in the Survey Office.

To enable parties to become thoroughly acquainted with their landmarks, and with the mode adopted for fixing their positions, notice will be given in the Government Gazette of any district in which surveys are about to be undertaken for this object, as also of the completion of such surveys.
