HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication of the following report of the proceedings of the mounted Police during the past month.

*By His Excellency's command,

Sept. 1st, 1841—Inspector of Police returned to York from Toodyay.—A policeman sent to Beverley.

2nd—Policeman Dalton sent to relieve Laidley at Toodyay.

5th—Policeman Laidlow arrived at Pork.

6th—Police engaged carting hay.

7th—Policeman Laidlow patroled to Bailey's farm.—One of the policemen patroled to Beverley.

9th—A policeman sent to Toodyay.—Policeman Laidley patroled to Beverley.—Inspector proceeded from York accompanied by three native constables, with a warrant to apprehend two boys named *Nunhey* and *Bonier* for stealing pigs at Mr. Robin's farm in the Beverley district.

10th—Inspector came upon a party of natives, not less than fifty, encamped in the vicinity of the Dale. Applied to them for information as to where the two boys would be found, and ascertained that one of them was with a party of natives a few miles off. Obtained the services of one of the party as a guide and proceeded to the spot, where the boy was found, taken, and secured.

11th—Inspector proceeded in search of the other boy, having ascertained that he was at a place called "Wallawanga," a hill celebrated for the werang root. On arriving at the spot the natives denied knowing where the boy was, but on the Inspector pointing out the folly of endeavoring to screen him they at last gave him up, and he was secured at 10 o'clock at night.

12th—Inspector returned with his party to York.

13th—One of the police patroled to Beverley.

16th—Policeman Laidlow patroled to Northam.

18th—Ditto patroled to Beverley.

21st—A policeman sent to Toodyay with summons for Quarter Sessions.

24th—A policeman patroled to Beverley.

25th—Policeman Laidlow patroled to Bailey's farm.

28th—Police patroled to Northam.

Inspector visited the several farms in the Toodyay district.

During the whole of the month one of the policemen was engaged in patrolling the Toodyay district under the orders of the Resident Magistrate.

The inspector in concluding his report states that the Natives have not committed themselves in any way but have appeared very desirous of remaining on amicable terms with the settlers. And in proof of this he instances his being able to secure two offenders when in company with a large party of natives with only the assistance of three native constables.

The light house which for some time past has been in course of erection at Gibraltar, being now nearly completed,—Notice is hereby given, that the light therein will be exhibited for the first time on the evening of the 1st August next, and thenceforth continued every night from sunset to sunrise.

Mariners are to observe that the Light-house is situate on Europa Point, and that a powerful light will be exhibited therein, and will burn at an elevation of (150) one hundred and fifty feet, or thereabouts, above the level of the sea.
