1841, from the Right Honorable the
Secretary of State, he is informed that, "the
Queen having, by order in Council of
12th August, 1841, ordered that Mates in
the Royal Navy, shall rank with Ensigns
in the Army, and Mates of three years
standing with Lieutenants in the Army,
Her Majesty's Government have recognised
the claims of those officers to the same ad-
vantages in the acquisition of land in the
Australian Colonies and Ceylon which are
enjoyed by Subalterns in the Army under
the regulations of August, 1841.
