BUOYS AND BEACONS, COCKBURN SOUND.

MARINERS are hereby apprised that the buoys and beacons which have at various times been placed between Garden Island and Carnac, for pointing out the channel into Cockburn Sound, have been washed away, and that, in the absence of means for replacing them the pilots have been instructed not to attempt the passage.

A good and perfectly safe route into the summer anchorage of Gage's Roads, off Swan River, will be found either to the north of Rottnest Island, or near its Southern Shore; and to the secure winter resort of Owen's Anchorage by passing through Gage's Roads,—on approaching which all vessels will be boarded by a pilot.
