His Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bill, now under the consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

A Bill to impose a Duty on all Goods imported into Western Australia, and not already subject to duty.

It being expedient to impose a duty upon all goods imported into the Colony which are not already subject to duties under any Act now in force, it is proposed—

That from and after the first of August next, the following duty shall be imposed and levied, that is to say:—on all Live Stock, not being direct from the United Kingdom, and upon all goods, wares, and merchandize, a duty of Fifty shillings for every One hundred pounds, according to their value.
