- No. 1.—An act to revise, renew, and amend an act entitled "An act to impose certain duties on imported spirituous liquors."
- No. 2.—An Act to renew and amend an act entitled "An Act for the regulation of the Customs of Western Australia."
- No. 3.—An act to revise, renew, and amend an act entitled "An act to regulate the sale of spirituous and fermented liquors by retail, and for the issuing of certain licenses connected therewith."
- No. 4.—An Act to continue for a limited time "An act to enable the inhabitants of any township to assess themselves for the improvement of the town."
- No. 5.—An act to naturalize Johann August Ludwig Preiss.
- No. 6.—An act to naturalize Frederick Waldeck.
- No. 7.—An act to revise, renew, and continue for a limited period an act entitled "An act to amend an act for the regulation of pilotage and shipping in the harbors of Western Australia."
- No. 8.—An act for repealing the laws now in force relative to the licensing and regulating of Public Houses, and for the better regulating the granting of licenses for the sale of ale, beer, wine, spirits, and other liquors in Western Australia in future.
- No. 9.—An act to provide for the registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in the Colony of Western Australia.
- No. 11.—An act for applying certain sums arising from the revenue receivable in the Colony of Western Australia to the service thereof, for the financial year commencing first of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one.
- No. 12.—An Act to naturalize Benjamin Franklin Simmons.
- No. 13.—An Act to impose a duty upon the transfer of landed property.

No. 14.—An act to remove the annoyance occasioned by dogs in the Colony of Western Australia.

No. 15.—An act for the regulation of pilotage and shipping in the harbors of Western Australia.

His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies has been pleased to approve of the following notice, published in the Government Gazette on 23d July, 1841, having for its object the improvement of the female portion of the native population.

With reference to the Notice dated the 23rd ultimo, relative to rewards to be offered to persons who may be instrumental in promoting the civilization of the Aborigines, by employing them on farms, and imparting to any of them a competent knowledge and skill in various operations and trades therein set forth: His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that, with a view of still further encouraging the civilization and improvement of these people, a remission in the purchase of land to the extent of £18 will be allowed on account of any native female who shall be proved, to the satisfaction of the Government, to have been constantly resident after this date in any settler's household during a space of two full years; and who shall have acquired a competent knowledge and skill in either of the several occupations of cook and thorough house servant, sempstress or dress maker, laundress or bonnet maker.

His Excellency is desirous at the same time to impress upon the public, that the remission of £18 hereby offered, as well as the amounts of remission mentioned in the former notice, do not authorize the purchase of a less quantity of land than 160 acres, and that the remission certificates will be, like others of a similar character, transferable.
