## Proclamation.

By His Excellency JOHN HUTT,  
Esquire, Governor and Com-  
mander-in-chief of Western Aus-  
tralia, and Vice Admiral of the  
same.

Whereas by an Act of the Local Legis-  
ture entitled "An Act to provide for the  
improvement of the Towns in the Colony of  
Western Australia" the Governor is em-  
powered to establish by Proclamation all  
Tolls, Rates, Dues, or charges which may  
hereafter be made payable at or by reason  
of the use of any lines or modes of commu-  
nication within any Town of the said Co-  
lony; and whereas the Trustees of the  
Town of Perth have erected a Jetty at the  
foot of William-street, and have recom-  
mended that the following scale of charges  
shall be made payable thereat: Now there-  
fore I the Governor by virtue and in exer-  
cise of the authority conferred upon me by  
the said recited Act, do hereby order and  
direct that the following Tolls, Rates, Dues,  
or charges shall be demanded and made  
payable at the said Jetty, to wit—
