GOVERNMENT JUVENILE IMMIGRANTS.

A SECOND party of Lads being expected to arrive in the Colony in March, the Guardian is ready to receive applications for their apprenticeship under the following regulations:—A preference will be given to applicants who are tradesmen; the indenture to be for a term of three, four, or five years; the master to pay in half-yearly payments to the Guardian, for the benefit of the apprentice, a sum of three pounds for the first year, increasing by an annual sum of ten shillings per year to the expiration of the indenture; the master to instruct his apprentice to the best of his skill in the trade or calling which he uses; and to furnish the apprentice with sufficient meat, drink, apparel, washing, lodging, and medical attendance and necessaries; and in case of death, to provide decent Christian burial; and secure, as far as in his power lies, the regular attendance of the apprentice at Divine Worship.
