Guildford to Perth, every afternoon at 2 o'clock (Sundays excepted).
Guildford to York, every Friday morning at 11 o'clock.
York to Toodyay, every Monday morning at 7 o'clock.
Toodyay to Guildford, every Tuesday afternoon at 7 o'clock.
Canning to Pinjarrah, every Friday morning at 7 o'clock.
Canning to Perth, every Monday morning at 7 o'clock.
Pinjarrah to Australind, every Monday morning at 7 o'clock.
Pinjarrah to the Canning, every Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock.
Australind to Bunbury, every Wednesday morning at 7 o'clock.

YORK MAIL.

Since the publication of the notice of the alteration in the day of the departure of the mail from Guildford to York, which appeared in the Government Gazette of the 14th inst., the following arrangement has been made with the contractor by which a day is given to persons residing either at York or Toodyay to reply to any letters they may have received.
