**An Act to impose certain Duties on Im-
ported Spirituous Liquors, and on
Wine and Tobacco.**

Whereas it is expedient to increase the amount of Duties payable on Imported Spirituous Liquors; and whereas it is advisable that various acts now in force relating to this subject should be repealed in order that their several provisions should be embodied in one Act; Be it therefore enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that so much of an Act passed in the fifth year of the reign of King William the Fourth, No. 3, intituled "An Act to impose certain Duties on Imported Spirituous Liquors," as relates to the amount of such duties, and an Act passed in the second year of Her present Majesty, No. 2, intituled "An Act to amend an Act intituled 'An Act to impose certain Duties on Imported Spirituous Li- quors,'" and an Act passed in the fourth and fifth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, No. 1, intituled "An Act to re- vise, renew, and amend an Act intituled "An Act to impose certain duties on Im- ported Spirituous Liquors,"" be and the same are hereby repealed from and after the passing of this Act, except so far as the continuance of any of them may be ne- cessary for carrying on or giving effect to any proceeding at law or in equity pending at the time of passing this Act, or for enforcing any cause of action or suit, or any right of contract then pending.

II. And be it therefore enacted, that from and after the passing of this Act, the follow- ing duties shall be imposed and levied—that is to say—

- 1st. On Spirits imported into the said Co- lony being the production and manu- facture of any part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or of any of the Colonies or Depen- dencies of the same, a Duty of Six Shil- lings for each and every Imperial gallon not exceeding the strength of Hydro- meter proof, and in the same propor- tion for like Spirits of greater strength.
- 2nd. On Spirits of Foreign production and manufacture imported into the said Colony from any part of the United Kingdom, or from any bonded ware- house in any of the British Colonies or Dependencies, a Duty of Eight Shil- lings for each and every Imperial gallon not exceeding the strength of Hydro- meter proof, and in the same propor- tion for like Spirits of greater strength.
- 3rd. On Spirits of Foreign production and manufacture imported into the said Colony from any Foreign place a Duty of Ten Shillings for each and every Im- perial gallon not exceeding the strength

of Hydrometer proof, and in the same proportion for like Spirits of greater strength.

4th. On all Wines imported into this Colony a Duty of Fifteen Pounds for every Hundred Pounds according to their value.

5th. On all sorts of Tobacco imported into this Colony a Duty of One Hundred Pounds for every Hundred Pounds according to its value.

III. Provided nevertheless, that the duties chargeable under this Act shall be taken to apply to all spirits already im- ported, and which shall remain in any bonded warehouse after the first day of August next.

IV. And be it enacted that the Duties aforesaid shall be collected in the manner pointed out by the provisions of an Act for the general Regulation of the Customs of this Colony.

V. And be it enacted, that this Act may be amended or repealed by any Act to be passed during this present Session:
