Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth September 22, 1843. REMOVAL OF LAND MARKS.

His Excellency the Governor directs the following letter, which has been addressed to a person resident on the Swan, to be published for general information, in order to warn other parties from being guilty of a violation of the law.

By His Excellency's command, PETER BROWN.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, September 21, 1843. SIR,-It having been reported to the

Governor, that you have removed the Land Marks which were placed to mark the boundaries of your own and the adjoining grant by the Government Surveyors: I am directed by His Excellency to inform you that, in so doing, you have rendered yourself liable to the penalty-named in the following section of the Act of Council 4th & 5th Vict. No. XX, viz .:

"And be it enacted, that any person "who shall be convicted before any two "Justices of the Peace of this Colony of "basic price of the Peace of this Colony of "having wilfully injured or defaced any "such landmark as aforesaid shall forfeit " and pay a sum not less than ten pounds "nor exceeding fifty pounds; and in default "of payment of the fine imposed by such "Justices, with the costs of proceeding, "shall be imprisoned and kept to hard labor " for such term not exceeding six calendar nonths as to the said Justices shall seem " At."

As, however, the Governor feels satisfied that you have done this in ignorance of any law prohibiting it, His Excellency will not direct any prosecution against you for this offenc, provided you at once replace the said bundary marks as conspicuously and permaently as they were before.

Whilst on this subject, it may be as well to extract for your information and guidance another section of the Act, which seriously affects persons who may deface or remove with a fraudulent intention any of the land marks which may have been placed by the Government Surveyors

"And be it enacted, that any person who shall be convicted before the Court of "Quarter Sessions of this Colony of wilfully, "and with intent to defraud any other per-"son, injuring, defacing or removing any "such landmark as aforesaid, shall be liable " at the discretion of the Court, to be trans-"ported beyond the seas for the term of "seven years, or to be imprisoned and kept "to hard labor for any term not exceeding "two years, nor less than six calendar "months."
