Proclamation.

By His Excellency JOHN HUTT,
Esq., Governor and Commander-in-
Chief of the Territory of Western
Australia, and its Dependencies,
and Vice-Admiral of the same.

In pursuance of the authority in me
vested by a certain act of the Imperial
Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland,
passed in the fifth and sixth years of Her
Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regu-
lating the sale of waste lands belonging
to the Crown in the Australian Colonies,"
I do hereby notify and proclaim that the
following portion of land in the District
of Plantagenet will be offered for sale by
public auction at the Sub-Collector of Re-
venue's Office in Albany, on Wednesday,
the third day of January next, at the
upset price affixed thereto, on the terms
and conditions set forth in certain land
regulations dated the 14th June, 1843—

COUNTRY GRANT.

Location No. 22, comprising 320 acres or
thereabouts, extending 50 chains West
and 64 chains South from a spot 227
chains S.S.W. from the S.E. corner of
location No. 12, granted to Sir James
Stirling. Upset price twenty shillings
the acre.

eral hereby gives notice, that sealed Ten-
ders in triplicate will be received at this

at 12 o'clock, from such person or persons
as may be willing to supply for the use of
Her Majesty's Service (1,500) Fifteen
hundred Bushels of Colonial Wheat, (60)
sixty pounds per bushel, the growth of the
harvest of 1843, and to be delivered before
the 31st March, 1844.

The wheat to be of unexceptionable
quality, free from moth, smut, and drake,
and to be delivered at the front entrance of

the Commissariat Store, Perth, free from
any charge for bags, casks, portorage, &c.,
to the Government, at the risk of the con-
tractor.

The wheat to be subject to the approval
of a Board of Survey before payment is
made.

No tender will be received for a less
quantity than (100) one hundred bushels;
and the parties whose tenders are accepted
will be required to enter into a bond with
two good sureties for the due performance
of their contract.

Payment for these supplies will be made
by Bills at thirty days sight on the Right
Honorable the Lords Commissioners of
Her Majesty's Treasury, payable in London
at par.
