His Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct the publication of the following particulars connected with the maritime approaches to Swan River, especially with reference to some buoys that have recently been laid down to mark tie chamel into Cockburn Sound between Garden Island and Carnac.

IMPORTANE TOMARINEIRS. Anchoraaes off swan river, western adutralia.
Cockburn Sound.- Puurlarge ca k buovs have lately bee, laid down io mark the channel into Cockburn Sound between Garden Island and Carnac, viz. two on the sonth side of the chamel, painted black, near the Challenger and Stigs rocks; and two on the north side, painted white, near the Middle Bank and Flat Ledre. The fair channel, in 4 to 6 fathoms water, lies between the black and white buny:. The Challenger buoy is laid down in 6 fathom:, half a cable's length from the N. E. extre mity of the rock; the Middle Bank booy is in $4 \frac{1}{2}$ fathoms on western edge of the bank; the Plat Ledye huoy is placed ont. side the two outermost rocks of that small reef, one of which has 9 fect water on it, and the other 3 fathoms; and the Stags buoy is in 6 fathoms on the N.E. extremity of its reef.

Gage's Road.-A large cask buoy, painted black, has been moored in 3 fit thoms water ahont 3 cables length N.W. by N. from Scott's Ledge, on the northern edge of Success Bank. This reef is narrow, and abont a quarter of a mile in length east and west, with 9 feet water on ita rocky ridge. The buoy is in a line between the Mewstone Rook and the north extremity of Rous's Head, at the entrance to Swan River, at 1 miles from the Rock, and 3 miles from the Head, and shonk be passed on its north side.
Hall's Banh, a small patch of 3 fathoms, recently discovered in H.M.S. Beagle, should be avoided by a ship of heavy draft of water standing into Gage's Road from the northward. It lies 13 miles off the main land, and bears from the hagstaff or Asthur's Head magnetic N. $37^{2}$ W., and S. $49^{\circ}$ W. from the white stantpatch to the northward,-having 8 and 9 fathoms water close to it all round.
The best anchorage in Gage's Road is in 6 or 7 tathoms water, a mile from Arthur's Head, with Scott's wooden jotty in South Bay juit on with the somh exiremity of the Heal (E, $\frac{1}{4}$. by compass), and south end of Rons's Head on with the north extremity of a low sandy point of land within the entrance to Swan River. Nearer to the shore the bottom is rocky.
