By His Excellency JOHN HUTT, Esq., Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

Whereas by the first section of an Act of Council made in the eighth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. V, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by proclamation, to be issued from time to time, with the advice of the Executive Council, to appoint and establish such place or places as to him shall seem meet at which all goods coming from any seaport town must be landed within the limits of any town-site,-

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation appoint and esta-blish the "Tub Beacon," upon the town-site of Busselton, as the place at which all goods, either imported coastwise or from beyond seas, shall be landed.

MEETING was held, by requisition of the inhabitants of the Upper Swan, on the 22nd current, to settle and determine the most advantageous Road to the newly-settled country of Jingenup, &c., with re-ference to Cruse's Mill. The position having been ascertained on the map, and the ground examined, a north line from the road at back of Thacker's was found to connect the given points, crossing at lower end of Waller's Pool, by diverging to the westward of the long swamp on Mr. Leake's boundary, appeared to meet the general view of a main line of communication. This matter will be brought forward at the General Meeting on the 16th April, at Perth, and all parties interested are requested to attend, in order that the sub-ject should be fully discussed, and finally arranged.
