Proclamation.

By His Excellency JOHN HUTT, Esq., Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

Whereas by the first section of an Act of Council made in the eighth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. V, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by proclamation, to be issued from time to time, with the advice of the Executive Council, to appoint and establish such place or places as to him shall seem meet at which all goods coming from any

scaport town must be landed within the limits of any town-site,-

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation appoint and esta-blish the "Tub Beacon," upon the townsite of Busselton, as the place at which all goods, either imported coastwise or from beyond seas, shall be landed.
