In pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, and passed in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that the following portions of land in the District of the Swan be offered for sale by public auction, by the Collector of Revenue, in Perth, on Wednesday, the 25th day of June next, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions

set forth in certain Land Regulations dated the 14th June, 1843:—

Country Grants.

Swan location No. 105, comprising 160 acres, more or less, on right bank of Ellen's Brook, extending 73 chains 86 links true N and S, with its SE corner about a mile N by W from the NW corner of Swan location No. 91.

Swan location No. 106, comprising 160 acres, more or less, on left bank of Ellen's Brook, extending 57 chains 60 links true north and south, with its SE corner nearly three-fourths of a mile NW by N from NW corner of location No. 105.

Swan location No. 107, comprising 320 acres, more or less, in form of an average double square, lying north and south about 31 chains eastward of Swan location No. 101, usually known as "Finjin."
