## Ho. XI.

An Ordinance for avoiling mpocessary repetitions in the Ordinances of the Governon and Legislative Council of Western Australia.
Whereas it is expediont to swoid ume cessary repetitions in the Colonial LawsBe it therefore enacted by His Excelleney the Governon of Westem Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that in all Acts or Ordimances heretofore passed, or hereafter to be passed, by the Governor with the advice and consent aforesaid, whless there be something in the subject or contert repug. nant to such construction, every word importing the masculime gender or singular mumber shall be construed to include the femenine and plural respectively, and vice Tersa, and bodies politic and corporate as well as individuals, and whenever mention is made in any such Act or Ordinance of the Governor, or of any Public Officer of the Colony, it shall be construed to mean the person lawfully acting as such in the Colony for the time being, and also that the word Act shall be construed to mean Ordinance, and vice versn.
II. And be it enacted, that this Ordinance shall commence and take effect from and after the passing thereof.
III. And be it enacted, that this Ordio mance may be altered, amended or repealed by any Ordinance to be passed during the prosent session.

## No. XII.

An Ordinance to remove doubts as to the power of Justices of the Peace of the Colony of Wertern Australia to inflict penalies under certain Acts of Par liament.
Whereas doubts have been suggested as 6 whether certain Acts, or parts of Acts of Parliamert, inftioting pecuniary penalties in certain cases, can be legally applied in the administration of justice to this Colony because the pecuniary penalties or sums of zaney so inflicted or leviable under some of the provisions of the said Acts are directed to go and be appropriated to the Overseer of the poor of some Parish, or to the Treasurer of some County, or otherwise in aid of the county rates, or are to be demanded by the Churohwardens of some Parish, or some other person or persons in particular of or in some County, or place or Parieh, or for some Charitable Institution, or some other local fund or purpose, and it is expedient to remove such donbts: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Westem Australia, with Che advice and consent of the Legislative Cowncll hercof, that in all cases where any Act of Parliament, or section of any Act of Parliament, otherwise applicable in the
ladministration of justice in this Colony, cannot be strictly omplied with by reason that the tine, forfeture or penalty infieted or leviable by the same Aet op getion tis made applicable to some local purposes as aforesata, or is to be demanded by some partioular person or persons, spoh fine, forfeiture of penaly ghall be leqiable withe? on any stuch demand, and shall pe preserved to the vise of Her Mresty, Her Meirs and Successors, and whall be prid to the Coll lector of Perenus for the publio uses of thens Colony, and the sumport of the Government horeof.
1T. And whereas Iusuces of the Peace for the Colony of Wastem A nstralia bave moretobreexercisex a summary parsdiction under and by virue of several Aots as hercimbefore mentioned; and whereas the said Justices, or some of them, have made, done and caused to be exacuted divers judgrents, orders, acts, and things, and have caused divers penalies to be ciforced. and sums of moneyto be levied, "under the powers of the said Acts; and whereas it is orpedient that all persons shall be protected and indomnified from vexatious proceed. inge for or by reason of any such judgment, sentence, act, or thing made, passed, done, or executed by them-Be it enacted, that no proceedings shall be commenced, prosecuted or maintained by any person whatsocver against any Justice of the Peace for having exercised summary jurisdiction ander any such Acts as aforesald, or against any other person whatsoever who may have done any act or thing under and by virtue of any judgment, sentence or order of any dustice of the Peace exercising such jurisdiction; and if any action or sum shall be brought againstany Iustice of the Peace, Constable, or wher person, for any act or thing done, or purporting to be done under or by virtue of any such Act of Pamliament as aforceat, the Defendant in every such action or suit may plead the general issue, and may give this Ordinance and the special matter in cridence at any trial to be had thereupon, and if the verdict or judgment shall be for the Defendant, or if the Flamtift be non ruted, or discor. time his notion or suit, or if apon demurrer fudgment shall be given against the Plain. tiff, the Defendant shall have treble costes, and shall have like remedy for the same as any other Defendant hath in any other case to recover coste by law.
III. And be it enacted, that this Ordinance may he altered, amended, or repealed by any Ordinance to be passed during the preseat session.
