PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency, Andrew Clarke, Esq. K.H. Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

In pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of waste lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that the following portion of land in the district of the Swan, be offered for sale by Public Auction, by the Collector of Revenue, at Perth, on Wednesday the 15th April next, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain land regulations dated the 14th June, 1843..

Swan location, No. 110, comprising 209 acres more or less, the boundaries extending 50 chains true south, and 69 chains, 67 links true west from a spot situate about 173½ chains west from Mr. Brockman's location of 320 acres at Conaning.

Upset price 20s. per acre.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency, ANDREW CLARKE, Esq. K.H. Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Local Legislature, intituled "An Act to regulate the establishment and management of Ferries and the Collection of Tolls thereat," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor or other Officer administering the Government of this Colony, by any Proclamation under his hand and seal, to establish any Ferry or Ferries at such place or places as to him shall seem expedient and to cause the collection at such Ferry or Ferries, of any Tolls not exceeding certain Tolls specified in the said recited Act: Now therefore I, the Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the authority conferred upon me by the said recited Act, do hereby order, appoint, and direct, that there shall be a ferry across the entrance to Peel's Inlet, from shore to shore. And I do hereby further direct, that the following land lately reserved from Location No. 16, Cockburn Sound, shall be used and appointed (until I shall otherwise order) for the purposes of the said Ferry:- That is to say, all that piece or parcel of land containing (1) one acre, or thereabouts, forming a portion of No. 16, Cockburn Sound, above referred to, bounded on the North by a line about 4 chains 26 links in length, extending due east or thereabouts from the eastern shore of the Entrance to Peel's Inlet through a spot about 21 chains North from the

Northern extremity of Sapphire Point, said line passing through a post 4 feet high in the centre of a long pile of stones one chain east from the shore aforesaid, and terminating Eastward at a similar post in the angle of a trench dug in the ground, bounded on the East by a line about 2 chains 50 links in length extending true South or thereabouts from post last mentioned to another post 4 feet high in the angle of a trench dug in the ground: on the South by a line about 3 chains 76 links in length true West or thereabouts, from post last mentioned to the shore aforesaid, passing through a post 4 feet high in the centre of a long pile of stones about 76 links East from the said stone; and on the West, by the Eastern shore aforesaid, between the North and South boundaries; And from and after the date of this my Proclamation, that the following Tolls shall be demanded and paid:—

For each person.....	9
Horse and rider.....	1 6
Cow or Bullock with driver.....	2 3
If the number exceed 3 the property of one person.....	1 6
For each Goat or Sheep not exceeding the number of 10, the property of one person.....	4
For each Goat or Sheep above that number and not exceeding 20 the property of one person.....	3
For each Sheep or Goat above that number and not exceeding 30 the property of one person.....	2
For each Sheep or Goat above that number the property of one person	1
For each pig.....	6
For carriages with two horses or Oxen.....	3 0
Ditto, Loaded.....	4 6
Ditto, with 4 horses or Oxen..	4 6
Ditto, Loaded.....	6 6
Ditto with 6 Horses or Oxen...	6 6
Ditto, loaded.....	9 0
Luggage of all kinds, for every cwt	4
For every 12 head of Poultry.....	9

Two thirds of the above rates only to be levied on fillies, geldings, and other species of quadrupeds under the age of 12 months.

An additional half fare to be charged on Sundays.

The ferry hours between the 1st Oct. and the 31st March, (both inclusive) to be from 6 in the morning until 8 in the evening, and from the 1st of April to the 30th Sept. (both inclusive) from 7 in the morning until 6 in the evening. Ferry rates to be double the above if before or after the above stated hours.

No Tolls shall be demanded for any horse or carriage conveying the person of the Governor or other Officer for the time being administering the Government of the said Colony, or any person in actual attendance on him; or for horses, beasts, carts, carriages, or other vehicles belonging to the Government and employed at the time of passing the Ferry in the Government service, or any stores or property of Government conveyed by such horses, beasts, carriage, or vehicle, conveying any clergyman in the discharge of his duties, or conveying the Post Office Mails, and all Her Majesty's Officers and Soldiers on route and being in proper staff, or regimental, or military dress or undress and their horses, and all carriages and horses belonging to Her Majesty or employed in her service when conveying persons, baggage, arms or ammunition, or returning therefrom, and all such baggage, arms, or ammunition, shall be exempted on passing this Ferry from the payment of any Tolls.
