P R O C L A M A T I O N .

By His Excellency, ANDREW CLARKE, Esq. K.H. Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

In pursuance of the authority in me vested, by a certain act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, and passed in the fourth and fifth year of her Majesty's reign, intituled "an act for regulating the sale of waste lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that the following portion of Land, in the district of Plantagenet, will be offered for sale by Public Auction, by the Sub Collector of Revenue, at Albany, on Wednesday, the 29th of July next, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations dated the 14th June, 1843.
