By His Excellency ANDREW CLARKE, Esquire, K.H. Governor and
Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western
Australia and its Dependancies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

In pursuance of the authority in me vested, by a certain Act of
the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, and passed in the
fourth and fifth years of her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for
regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the
Australian Colonies," I do, hereby, notify and proclaim, that the
following portion of land, in the district of the Murray, be offered for
sale by Public Auction by the Collector of Revenue, at Perth, on Wednes-
day the 2nd day of September next, at the upset price affixed thereto,
on the terms and conditions set forth in certain land regulations dated
the 14th June, 1843.

Murray Location, No. 18. Comprising 4 acres, more or less,
between the northern mouth of the Murray River and the mouth
next to the south of it and bounded on the east by a true
north and south line.

Upset price, £2 per acre.
