WARRANT.

By His Excellency ANDREW CLARKE, Esquire, K.H. Governor and Commander-in-Chief, and Vice Admiral in and for the Colony of Western Australia.

TO all whom these presents shall come, I, Andrew Clarke, Esquire, K.H., Governor and Commander-in-Chief and Vice Admiral in and for the Colony of Western Australia, send Greeting. WHEREAS, at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, holden at Perth, in the said Colony, on the seventh day of October, One thousand eight hundred and forty-six, George Barr, late of Perth aforesaid, a Private in Her Majesty's 51st Regiment, was tried and convicted of breaking and entering into a house, and stealing therefrom a certain piece of calice, and thereupon sentenced to be transported for seven years. NOW KNOW YE, that by virtue and in exercise of a certain power and authority for that purpose in me vested, and for divers causes me thereunto moving, I have extended to the said George Barr, the benefit of Her Most Gracious Majesty's Royal Prerogative of Mercy, hereby granting to him a Pardon, on condition that he shall be confined in Her Majesty's Gaol at Fremantle, for the term of three years, to be computed from the said seventh day of October, One thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and that during such term and confinement the said George Barr shall be kept to hard labor.
