of the following description of a Public Road between the East end of the Perth Causeway and a bridge over the Helena River at Guildford, which has been adopted by the Road Trustees.

Road to be I chain or 66 feet wide, on the Northern and Western sides of the following lines, which are described with reference to the true meridian, and are marked at their respective angles and elsewhere by good stout posts 3 to 4 feet out of the ground, mostly squared and pointed at the top, and all marked R.T.

Commencing at East end of the Causeway, the Road to run 5 chains 80 links in direction S 55° E, then 29 chains 70 links N 87 E, then 162 chains 74 links N. 59 45' E., then 12 chains 99 links N. 38 E, then 47 chains 77 links N 24° E to a squared and pointed post 4 feet high on N.E. boundary line of Swan Location No. 33, then 79 chains 35 links N 413° E to a similar post on the N E, boundary of Location No. 30, then 34 chains 73 links N. $50\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. to another similar post on N.E. boundary of location No. 29, then 36 chains 56 links N 53½° E, then 41 chains 82 links N 44½° E to a squared and pointed post $3\frac{1}{4}$ feet high on NE boundary of location No. 26, 67 chains 4 links N 31° 40'E, and 13 chains 23 links N 27° 35' E to a large squared and pointed post at commencement of the NE boundary of location No. 20 on on the Helena River, and on the SE side of the public bridge across the said river.

Also the public road to include a small triangle of land near the causeway aforesaid, bounded on the N by the E portion of the second line hereinbefore described, on the W by the second line of a public road gazetted as such on the 7th December, 1846, and extending S 5° E 7 chains 90 links, and on the S by a line extending N 60° E 17 chains 32 links between two large squared and pointed posts.
