CIRCULAR.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth,
May 12, 1847.
Sir,—I am directed by the Governor to
inform you, that being desirous of affording every facility to any persons wishing to obtain Chinese or other servants from Singapore, it is his intention to despatch the Colonial Schooner immediately for that purpose, if a sufficient number of servants is applied for under the following regula-

Each person desiring a Servant is to furnish the Resident Magistrate with a description of the sort of Servant required, and to pay down a deposit of £5 for each individual applied for; this deposit is applicable to the expenses of purchasing bed-

ding or clothing, and for any other purposes required by the Servant, and is to be considered as a charge against his first year's wages, and any balance remaining unexpended will be repaid to the applicant.

A passage and maintenance on board will be provided gratuitously by the Government, but all other expenses must be borne by the applicant.

Instructions will be given to Mr Help-man to make every effort to procure the actual description of servant desired by each subscriber, but the Government will not be responsible for the success of his endeavors in this respect.

His Excellency desires that you will make this known to the inhabitants of your District, as early as possible, as it is highly desirable that the vessel should be dispatched without delay.
