Whereas power and authority have been vested in the Governor of Western Austra lia, acting ly and with the advice and congent of the Legislative Council thereof, to make, ordain, and establish all such laws and Ordinances as may be necessary for the peace, order and good government of the same: Be it therefore esacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that out of the produce of the Revenue of the said colony, there shall and may be issued and applied, any sum or sums of money not exceeding Thitty six pounds, five shillings, and one penny for defraying the supple meatary charge for she serfice of the year

WHRREAS an Act way passed in the Fourth and Fift years of the Reign of Her present Majesty entitled "An Act for re. pealing the Laws now in force relating to the liconsing and regubating of Public Houses, and for the better rogulating the grant. ing of Licenses for the sale of Ale, Beer, Wine, Spivits, and other Liquors in Western Australia in future:" and whereas it is expedient to amend the said Act in sce veral respects-Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the consent of the Legislative Comneil thereof, that it shall be lawful for two Itustices to exeretse all the powers and perform all the acts divected to be exercised and performed by three Justices according to the said Act-Provided always that nothing in this Act contained whall be construed to repeal the fifteenth clause of an Act passed in the Seventh yeas of the Reign of Her present Majesty entitled "An Aci to regulate summary

Complaints having been made of much inconvenience and annoyance being occaw sioned to Owners of Land in fee simple, ins consequence of licenses being obtaifed to depasture lands contiguous to their boundaxics, withont their Criowledge and withont any opportunity being given of informing themselves of such applications, and of applying on their own behalf. His Excel. lency, herefore, with a view to remove the ground of such complainta, has directed it lo be published for general information, that, henceforth, all application for' guch Licenses will be published in the Govern ment Gazette for one month, in order to give the Owner in Feesimple of any comtiguons lands, an opportunity of applying within that period for the same block of land, in which case he will be considered entitled to a preference, and should two or more awnere, in fee simple, of contiguous lands, be affected by the required Licensem the right to it, as between such owners only, and to the exclusion of any person not so interested, must be decided by Auction.
