In pursuance of the authority in me vested, by a certain Act of the Imperial Par-liament of Great Britain and Ireland, and passed in the 5th & 6th years of Her Ma-jesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for regu-lating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies." "That it shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council at any time by Proclamation under his hand to suspend the operation of this Ordinance for such time as he may deem expedient.'

I do hereby notify and proclaim the suspension of the operation of the aforesaid Ordinance for a term of Six Months from the 1st Instant on account of the present depressed state of the Sandalwood trade.
