In pursuance of the authority in me vested, by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, and passed in the 5th & 6th years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that the following Portion of Land in the district of the Avon, will be offered for sale by Public Auction by the Collector of Revenue, at Perth, on Wednesday, the 21st day of June next, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain land regulations, dated 14th June 1843.

In pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Ordinance of the Legislative Council No. XX. of the X Victoria intituled "An Ordinance to Establish a Toll to be levied upon Sandalwood, to be applied to the construction and repair of Public Roads and lines of communication," and which provides (sec viii). "That it shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council at any time by Proclamation under his hand to suspend the operation of this Or-

dinance for such time as he may deem expedient."

I do hereby notify and proclaim the suspension of the operation of the aforesaid Ordinance for a term of Six Months from the 1st Instant on account of the present depressed state of the Sandalwood trade.
