His Excellency the Governor having reason to believe that the practice of cutting Timber and depasturing stock on crown lands, by unauthorised parties is carried on to an extent very injurious to the Revenue, has directed the publication for general information of the following Circular which has been addressed to the Resident Magistrates.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, Oct. 17, 1848.

Sir,—I am directed by the Governor to inform you, that you are to employ the Police at such periods, as the convenience of the public service of the district will admit of, to go about the country with the view of ascertaining any violation of the Government Regulations respecting the cutting of timber or the depasturing of stock on crown lands, and of furnishing the Resident Ma-

gistrate, in each district with a list of all those whom they may find cutting timber on any crown lands so that in every instance of the infraction of such Regulations, the Government Resident may be enabled to take the most effectual means in his power to prevent the Public Revenue being defrauded by those not having licenses, following such practices and to punish the parties engaged in them.

For the further information of all whom it may concern, it is notified that the act of Council 7 Vict. No 14, renders parties in the unauthorised occupation of Crown lands liable—

For the first offence to a penalty of any sum not exceeding £10.

For the second offence—any sum not exceeding £20.

And for the third and any subsequent offence—any sum not exceeding £50.
