HIS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Regulations and Rates of Charges to be observed and levied in the Warehousing of Goods in Government Stores from and after this date:—

For every pipe, butt, piece, or puncheon, per week 6d.

For every half-pipe or hoghead 3d.

For every quarter cask, barrel, or package of smaller size..... 2d.

For every small case or package 1d.

All spirits or goods for warehousing to be delivered at the warehouse and stowed away at the expense of the proprietor, under the superintendence of the Government Cooper, as likewise the delivery of the same from the warehouse. And if any spirits or goods liable to duty be kept on the beach and not removed to the warehouse immediately on landing, the expense of watching or carrying the same to the Bonded Warehouse, at the option of the officer, will be charged to the proprietor.

The Government will not be answerable for leakage or wastage.
