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**Proclamation**

*By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.*

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portion of Land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector of Revenue, at Perth, on Wednesday, the 16th day of January next, at one o'clock, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations dated 14th June, 1843:—

*Kojonup Location No. 2*—comprising 10 acres, more or less, in form of a square lying true North and South, true East and West,—the North-east corner being at centre of a spring known as Joseph's Well, or "Warkelup," about 4 miles E.S.E. from Kojonup Spring.

Upset price, £1 per acre.

**Proclamation**

*By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.*

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Ordinance of the

Legislative Council, No. XX. of the 10th Vict, intituled "An Ordinance to establish a Toll to be levied on Sandalwood, to be applied to the construction and repair of Public Roads and lines of Communication," and which provides (Section VIII) "that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, at any time, by proclamation under his hand to suspend the operation of this Ordinance, for such time as he may think expedient;"

—I do hereby notify and proclaim the suspension of the aforesaid Ordinance for a further period from the 31st December until the 4th November, 1850, upon which day the said Ordinance will expire.

A New system of keeping the Colonial Public Accounts will be brought into operation on the 1st January next, in conformity with instructions received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, having for its object the regulation of the Expenditure in strict conformity with the Estimates of the Legislative Council.

His Excellency the Governor has directed that the financial transactions of the several Departments of the Government shall be under the especial care and supervision of the head of each Department, or of some person connected with the Department, residing in Perth, especially nominated for such purpose.

The following Officers, not being the Heads of the Departments, have therefore been called upon to arrange and conduct the Accounts of the Departments placed opposite their names:—

*Clerk of the Peace*—The Judicial Depart

ment, including Resident Magistrate.  
*Colonial Chaplain, Perth*—Ecclesiastical  
Department.

*Guardian of Aborigines, Perth*—Aborigines and Police.

*Sheriff*—Gaols.

*Col. Chaplain, Perth, as Chairman of Education Committee*.....

The Abstracts of Salaries and Allowances will be made up by these Officers, to include the claims of all parties connected with each department, whether resident in Perth or elsewhere: it will not therefore be necessary, in future, for persons non-resident in Perth to render a separate Salary Abstract, but they must appoint an agent or assign in Perth to receive their Salaries or other claims, it being essential that the Treasurer should obtain the receipt of the person to whom the money is paid.
