Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief in
and over the Territory of Western Aus-
tralia and its Dependencies, and Vice
Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by the first Section of an
Ordinance passed in the 9th year
of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "an Or-
dinance to make provision for the Trial of
Criminal Offences at Albany and other
remote districts of the colony of Western
Australia." It is enacted that Courts of
General Sessions of the Peace for the va-
rious districts of this colony may be holden
at such times and in such places as the
Governor shall by Proclamation from
time to time appoint,—now therefore I,
the Governor by this my Proclamation,
appoint that Courts of General Quarter
Sessions may be holden for the future at
Albany, on the third Wednesday in Fe-
bruary, the third Wednesday in May, the

third Wednesday in August, the third Wednesday in November, in each Year, until further notice, instead of the second Wednesday as heretofore.

Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the Governor is empowered to establish by Proclamation, all Tolls, Rates, Dues, or Charges,

which may hereafter be made payable at or by means of any lines or modes of communication within any part of the said colony.—Now therefore I, the Governor, by virtue and in exercise of such authority do hereby establish the following Tolls and charges and do order that the same shall and may be demanded and paid at and for the use of the Perth Causeway and Canning River Bridge, from and after the 31st March next ensuing,—

For every horse ass or mule..... 3d.
For every head of neat cattle 3
For every score of sheep 3
Unweaned stock following the mothers (exempt).
For every gig, chaise, cart, dray or other vehicle drawn by one horse, ass, or mule or by one pair of oxen 6d.
For every additional horse, ass, or mule or pair of oxen 6

The following are exempt from any charge or Toll whatever,—namely, His Excellency the Governor or any person in official attendance on him at the time, all horses, cattle or vehicles of any description in the service of the Governor or in his employ; all Public Officers when actually engaged on duty; all Her Majesty's Officers and Soldiers being in proper Regimental or Military Uniform, dress or undress; all horses, beasts, carts, carriages, or other vehicle whatever belonging to the Local Government or to the Commissariat or employed at the time by them in any way in the public Service, either by contract or otherwise; all Constables and Police Officers on duty; all persons actually going to or returning from any place of Worship on Sunday passing through the said Toll gate between the hours of 7 a.m. and 9 p.m. and their horses and vehicles respectively.

An additional charge of one half the above scale to be made between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5 a.m. from the 1st day of October to the 31st March, and 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. from the 1st day of April to the 30th day of September.
