TN pursuance of the authority in me H vested by a certain Act of the Impexial Papliament of Great Britain and Treland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Lauds belonging to the Crom in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portion of Land will bo offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector of Revenue, at Perth, on Wednesday, the 27th day of February next, at one o'clock, at the upset price affixed thercto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations dated 14th June, 1843 :-

By His Evcellency Omames FiqzGeratd, Esquive, Commander in the Royal Navy, Govemor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Toritory of Westom Australia and its Dependenoies, and Fieo Adminal of the sone.

HRREAS by the first Section of an Ordinance passed in the 9 th year
of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "an Or-
dinance to make prorision for the Trial of Criminal Offences at Albany and other remote districts of the colony of Western Australia." It is enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace for the various districts of this colony may be holden at such times and in such places as the Governor shall by Proclamation from time to time appoint,-now therefore $I$, the Goveraor by this my Proclamation, appoint that Courts of General Quarter Sessions may be holden for the future at Albany, on the third Wednesday in February, the thitd Wednesday in May, the third Wednesday in August, the third Wednesday in Kovember, in each Year, until further notice, instead of the second Wednesday as heretofore.

By His Eccelleney Ohameis TitaGerald, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Nouy, Governor and Commonder-in-Chief in and over the Tervitory of Western Australia and its Depenlencies and Fice-Ldmirat of the same.

WHEREAS the Goveruor is enpowered to establish by Prochamation, all Tolls, Rates, Dues, or Charges, which may herealter be made payable at or by means of any lines or modes of commumication within any part of the said co-lony.-Now therefore I, the Governor, by virtue and in exercise of such anthonity do hereby establish the following Tolls and charges and donder that the same shall and may be demanded and patd att and for the use of the Perth Causeway and Canning River Bridge, from and after the 31st March next Gusuing, -

Prodanation is made of the establishment of the following Tolls and charges for the use of the Perth Canseway and Canning River Bridges from and after the lst Maroh next ensuing:-
For every horse ass or mule................. 3n.
For every head of neat oattlo .............. 3
Tor every seore of sheep .................... 3
Unweaned stook following the mothers (exompt)
For every gig, claive, cant, dray or oher
rebicle darm by one horse, ass, or mule
or by one pair of oxen. $\qquad$ 6d.
Tor crery additional horse, ass, or mule
or par of oxen
The following are cxempt from any charge or Toll whaterer,-namely, Mis Excellenoy the GoFernor or any person in official attendance on him at the time, all horses, cattle or venicles of any description in the service of the Governor or in his employ; all Public Offeers when aciually engaged on duty; all Her Majesty's Offeers and Soldiers being in proner Regimental or Military Uniform dress or undress; all horses, beasts, carts, carriages, or other vehicle whiterer belonging to the Local Covermment or to the Commissariat on enployed at tho time by thom in any way in the public Service, either by contract or otherwise; all Constables and Police Oflicers on duty; all persons actually going to or returning from any place of Worshipousunday passing through the saidToll gate between the hours of 7 am . and 9 p.m. and their horses and vehicles respectively.
An additional charge of one hat the above scale to be made between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5 a.m. frem the lst day of October to the 31st Mawh, and $7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. and 6 am . from the list day of $A$ pril to the 30 th day of September.
