N pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years' of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies." I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portion of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction by the Sub-Collector at Bunbury on Wednesday the 1st May, next at one O'Clock, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations; dated 14th June, 1843.

Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERADD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by the Governor of Western Australia, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, in the 12th Year of Her Majesty's Reign, namely:

12th Vict. No. 2-An Ordinance to make perpetual an Ordinance intituled,

"An Ordinance to make provision for the Trial of Criminal Offences at Albany, and other Remote Districts of the Colony of Western Australia.

12th Vict. No. 3—An Ordinance to make perpetual an Ordinance, intituled "An Ordinance to regulate the constitution of Juries for the Trial of Criminal. Offences at Albany, and other remote Districts in the Colony of Western Australia, and to limit the right of Challenge to some extent in certain cases.'

12th Vict. No. 4-" An Ordinance for Taking an Account of the Population, and of the amount of live Stock, and Crop and other particulars of the Colony of Western Australia."

Now therefore I, the Governor, do hereby Proclaim and make known to all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinanees.

Dowager. Her Majesty expired at Stanmore Priory, on the morning of the 2nd instant, at 7 minutes before 2 o'clock, to the great affliction of the Royal Family and of all classes of Her Majesty's subjects.

IS Excellency the Governor, directs the publication for general information of the following Clauses of the Imperial Land Sales Act, 9 & 10 Vict., Cap.

104, the provisions of which will be rigidly

3. And whereas it may be necessary that effectual Provision should be made for protecting such Waste Lands as aforesaid from being occupied without Authority, and also for dispossessing any Person in the Occupation of any such Waste Lands as aforesaid, in case of the Forfeiture of any such Demise or Licence, or in case of the Breach or Nonperformance of the Conditions thereof, or in case of the holding over by any such Persons or Person after the Expiration of any such Demise or Licence, or after the End of the Term for which the same may have been granted or made; be it enacted, That on Information in Writing for that Purpose preferred by the Governor for the Time being of any such colony as aforesaid, or by any Person authorized by any such Governor on that Behalf, to any Justice of the Peace acting in and for any of the Colonies aforesaid, or in and for any County or other District thereof, setting forth that any Person or Persons is or are in the unlawful Occupation of any of the Waste Lands of the Crown in any such Colony, or is or are in the Occupation of any such Lands in virtue or under colour of any such Demise or Licence as aforesaid although such Demise or Licence had been forfeited or although the Conditions thereof had been broken or unfalfilled, or although such Demise or Li-cence had expired, or although the Term for which the same had been granted or made, had come to an end, it shall be the Duty of such Justice to is-sue his Summons for the Appearance before any Two Justices of the Peace, at a Place and a Time therein to be specified, of the Person or Persons against whom any such Complaint shall be so made and at the Time and Place so to be specified such Two Justices (on the Appearance of the Person or Persons charged, or on due Proof of the Service on him, her, or them, or at his, her, or their usual Place of Abode, of any such Summons,) shall proceed to hear and inquire of the Truth of the Matceed to hear and inquire of the Truth of the Matter and Things which may be alleged in any such Information, and on being satisfied of the Truth thereof, either by the Admission of the Person or Persons charged, or on other good and sufficient Evidence, the said Justices shall issue under their Hand a Warrant addressed to the Sheriff or Description. puty Sheriff, or Commissioner, or other Officer of the Colony or District acting for or on behalf of Her Majesty, commanding and requiring him forthwith to dispossess and remove any such Perforthwith to dispossess and remove any such Person or Persons from any such Waste Lands of the Crown as aforesaid, and to take possession of the same for and on behalf of Her Majesty; and it shall be the Duty of any such Sheriff, Deputy Sheriff, Commissioner, or other such Officer as aforesaid, to carry such Warrant forthwith into execution according to the Tenor and Exigency thereof. Provided always that nothing herein her thereof: Provided always, that nothing herein-be-fore contained shall extend to any Person having occupied Waste Lands within the Boundary of Lo-cation without Interruption for the Space of Twenty Years next before the passing of this Act.

4. And be it enacted, That from and after the Day when this Act shall come into effect in the Manner herein-after mentioned, any Person, unless claiming under a Sale or Demise from Her Majesty claiming under a Sale or Demise from Her Majesty or from some Person acting in the Name and on behalf of Her Majesty, who shall be found occupying any Waste Lands of the Crown in any of the Colonies aforesaid, either by residing or by erecting any Hut or Building thereon, or by clearing, enclosing, or cultivating any Part thereof, or who shall depasture any Cattle thereon, and who shall not previously have obtained a Licence from the said Governor for the Occupation of such Lands, or who shall occupy or depasture as aforesaid after such Licence shall have been determined by Forfeiture or otherwise, shall be liable on Conviction feiture or otherwise, shall be liable on Conviction thereof to the Penalties following; that is to say, for the First Offence a Sum not exceeding Ten Pounds, for the Second Offence a Sum not exceeding Twenty Pounds nor less than Ten Pounds, and for the Third or any subsequent Offence a Sum not exceeding Fifty Pounds nor less than Twenty Pounds: Provided always, that no Information

shall be laid or brought for any Second or subsequent Offence until the Expiration of Founteen, clear Days from the Date of the previous Convic-

tion.

5. And be it enacted. That the Penalties herein-before imposed shall be recovered in a summary
Way before any One or more Justice of Justices
of the Peace, upon the Information or Complaint
on Oath of the Governor for the Time being of
any such Colony as aforesaid, or of any Person
authorized by any such Governor on that Behalf.
