N pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years' of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies." By His Excellency Charles FitzGerald, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

THĚREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by the Governor of Western Australia, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, in the 12th Year of Her Majesty's Reign,

12th Vict. No. 2-An Ordinance to make perpetual an Ordinance intituled, "An Ordinance to make provision for the Trial of Criminal Offences at Albany, and other Remote Districts of the Colony of Western Australia.

12th Vict. No. 3-An Ordinance to make perpetual an Ordinance, intituled "An Ordinance to regulate the constitution of Juries for the Trial of Criminal Offences at Albany, and other remote Districts in the Colony of Western Australia, and to limit the right of Challenge to some extent in certain cases."

12th Vict. No. 4-"An Ordinance for Taking an Account of the Population, and of the amount of live Stock, and Crop and other particulars of the Colony of Western

Australia."

Now therefore I, the Governor, do hereby Proclaim and make known to all whom. it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinanees.

THE attention of the Public is again requested to a Notice, which appeared in the Government Gazette, of July 11, 1849, calling on parties having claims against the Government to send in their accounts monthly, as well as on heads of Departments, to see that no accounts are allowed to remain outstanding beyond that period.
