Post Office Charges.

HIS Excellency the Governor in virtue of the Ordinance 9 Viet. No. 6, "To provide for the conveyance and Postage of Letters" and of the provision of the said Act, empowering him "to increase and reduce the postage of the same from time to time as to the Governor shall seem meet," has directed, for the purpose of making more adequate provision to meet the expenses attendant on the conveyance of the Overland & Foreign Mails, the following amended scale of Post Office Charges to be published for general information.

For every letter not exceeding ½ oz. in weight forwarded or received <i>via</i> Singapore or Angier.....	1 0
For every letter exceeding ½ oz., for each additional ½ oz. or fraction	0 6
For every other ship letter not exceeding ½ oz. received or forwarded from or to places beyond the limits of the colony.....	0 8
For every letter exceeding ½ oz. for each additional ½ oz. or fraction	0 4
For every letter not exceeding ½ oz. passing from one Post Office to another in the colony	0 4
Every double letter exceeding 1 oz. each additional oz.	0 6

All parcels passing through any Post Office are liable to half postage only, provided they do not contain any writing.

Letters or packets posted at any Post Office addressed to parties residing within the precincts of the town or district in which that Post Office may be situated are liable to the charge of one penny.
