IS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following description of Four Convicts who effected their escape from Fremantle on Tuesday evening, the 7th instant, with the Whaleboat belonging to the Convict Establishment; and masters of vessels and all other persons are hereby warned that under 17th clause of the Act of Council 14 Vict. No. 6, any person "guilty of aiding the escape or intended escape from the colony of a convict, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding £500, or to imprisonment not exceeding two years."
