No. 10 Main Piles, 12x9 and 20 feet long

8 Spur Piles, 9 x 9 and 12 feet long. To be squared and perfectly straight, and one end pointed.

" 180 Sheet Planking, $9x3\frac{1}{2}$, 12 feet long, sawn, and one end pointed.

20 Pieces of Scantling, 6 inches deep, cut bevel, 3 inches top and 4½ bottom, and 16 feet long.

"26 Pieces 8x4, 9 feet long.

"16 Pieces 8x4, 10 feet long.

The whole of the above to be of the best description of Mahogany, straight grained, and subject to the examination and approval of the Superintendent of Public Works

One-third of the above quantity (in equal proportions) is to be delivered within 14 days from the date of contract, and the remainder within one month from the same period.
