IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication of the following Dispatch for general information.

By His Excellency's command, T. N. YULE. Acting Colonial Secretary.

Downing Street, January 1, 1848. SIR,-I have to acknowledge the receipt of your dispatch No. 55, of the 13th September, recommending an increase in the Military force now stationed in Western Australia; and I have to acquaint you that I am not prepared to alter the arrangement under which it was determined that 100 men should be stationed in that Colony.

If, as you state, the settlers think proper to extend themselves over so wide an extent of country as that to which you advert, you will cause it to be distinctly understood by them, that Her Majesty's Government will not undertake to increase the Military force in the Colony for the purpose of extending additional protection to them, when so widely scattered, and that they must either run the risk of being

without such protection, or they must support without such protection, or they must support at their own cost an Armed Police for the pur-pose of affording it. The expense of such a Folice force, might I conceive, be very pro-perly provided for by an assessment on the cattle and sheep, for the pasturage of which the colonists propose to extend the limits of the territory they occupy.
