IN pursuance of the authority in me  
vested by a certain Act of the Impe-  
rial Parliament of Great Britain and Ire-  
land, passed in the 5th and 6th years of  
Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act  
for regulating the sale of Waste Lands be-  
longing to the crown in the Australian colo-  
nies." I do hereby notify and proclaim that  
the following portions of land will be offered

lector or Sub-Collectors of Revenue, at  
the places and on the days hereinafter  
mentioned, at one o'clock, at the upset  
price affixed to each lot respectively, on the

## Proclamation.

*By His Excellency* CHARLES FITZGERALD,  
*Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,*

*Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in*  
*and over the Territory of Western Aus-*  
*tralia and its Dependencies, and Vice-*  
*Admiral of the same.*

WHEREAS by an Act of the Local  
Legislature, intituled "An Ordina-  
nance to provide for the Establishment of  
a scale of Pilotage Fees and Light Dues,"  
it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the  
Governor or other Officer administering  
the Government of this Colony, by any  
Proclamation under his hand and seal, to  
establish a scale of Light Dues not ex-  
ceeding the rate of Sixpence per ton re-  
gister, to be paid by each ship or vessel  
coming into any Port, Harbor, or Anchor-  
age, in the said colony, in the vicinity of  
which any such light has been established.  
Now therefore, I, the Governor, by virtue  
and in exercise of the authority conferred  
upon me by the said recited Act, do hereby  
order, appoint, and direct, that from and  
after the date of this my Proclamation, the  
following dues shall be demanded from,  
and paid by, all vessels entering and leav-  
ing the Port of Fremantle:—

All Coasters to pay one Penny per ton  
register in, and one Penny per ton out, or  
to compromise by the annual payment of  
the sum of One Pound. All other vessels  
to pay Two Pence per register ton in, and  
Two Pence per register ton out.
