Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Australian colonies." I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portions of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector or Sub-Collectors of Revenue, at the places and on the days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations dated 14th June, 1843.

At Perth, on Wednesday, the 6th August:—

Perth Building Lots, Y 25, and W 7. Upset price £12 each.

Guildford Building Lot No. 176. Upset price £7.

Avon Location No. 81.—Comprising 10 acres more or less, in form of a square, extending 10 chains magnetic SSE and 10 chains WSW from a spot 10 chains SSE from centre of Stanton's spring, opposite boundaries parallel and equal to each other. Upset price £1 per acre.

William's River Location S.—Containing 20 acres more or less, in form of an average square on right bank of William's River, next above Location D. Upset price £1 per acre.

At Bunbury, on Wednesday, the 13th August:—

Wellington Location No. 13.—Containing 10 acres more or less, in form of an average square on left bank of Preston River, next above Location No. 40. Upset price £1 per acre.
