I$N$ pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5 th and 6 th years of Her Majesty's reigu, intituled, "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Australian colonies."
